Application deadline(s) for admission	Applications for the first semester are open from September 1st to October 12 of the previous year. Applications for the second semester are open from March 1st to April 12 of the same year.



Language requirements for undergraduate and graduate students.	Students should have a minimum of 3 semesters of college-level Spanish before beginning regular classes at the USM. A Language Requirement Form is requested to non-native Spanish speaker, which must be signed by the student and the coordinator. Alternatively you have the option to document your Spanish skills by attaching a proficiency certificate in Spanish indicating a minimum of B1 (CEFR).
